More than five decades ago, Jerry
Harwin and Caesar Uyesaka sipped
coffee at Caesar's Restaurant, talking
about the need for a sports group in
Santa Barbara that could help the local
athletic community in times of need.
After Jerry and Caesar shared a couple
more coffee breaks together, the Santa
Barbara Athletic Round Table was
born. Its motto: The advancement and
betterment of all sports and athletics in
the greater Santa Barbara area.

The SBART got off to a fast start. Its first organizational meeting was held at Santa Barbara's East Beach on January 25, 1968. Hundreds of people attended this meeting, and over 200 joined that evening as Charter Members.

The SBART's first annual banquet was held at Santa Barbara City College on June 22, 1968. Through membership dues, contributions, fundraising events and local foundations, the Round Table has raised more than \$2 million for local athletics.

Harry's Plaza Café was the site of the SBART's first press luncheon held on September 14, 1970. The luncheons, initiated by the new president, Bill Bertka, were similar to a "Monday Morning Quarterback Club." All area schools were represented by the head coaches of the sports in season. For over four decades the SBART luncheons have been held at Harry's every Monday, attended by standing-room-only crowds.

Since its first meeting back in 1968, the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table has helped thousands of individuals and organizations by raising funds to support their athletic programs. The Round Table is proud to help student-athletes at all levels compete in events they would otherwise not have been able to attend.

It is with our deepest regards and warmest thanks that we acknowledge and celebrate the vision and hard work of our founders, Caesar Uyesaka, Jerry Harwin and Bill Bertka.

2018-19 Athletic Highlights

It was a year of change in local sports.

The make-up of high school leagues changed, and the prep calendar started earlier than ever.

In addition, the most rainfall the area has received in years caused several schedule changes during the early part of the spring season. Teams eventually got all their games in.

Santa Barbara received some national attention as it became the center of men's college soccer. UCSB hosted the NCAA College Cup for second time. Maryland, Indiana, Michigan State and Akron enjoyed some nice weather during their stay in early December and Maryland was crowned national champion.

In the fall, Dos Pueblos, Santa Barbara High and Bishop Diego all made it to the CIF football playoffs and went out in the first round. In 8-man football, Cate reached the quarterfinals and had to deal with the Woolsey Fire in L.A. County before eventually finishing the second half of the game against Windward on a Monday in Newport Beach.

Santa Barbara High's boys' water polo had a nice playoff run, advancing to the CIF semifinals.

In prep cross country, Dos Pueblos junior Joseph Pearlman qualified for the CIF State Meet.

Yuka Perera of the San Marcos girls' tennis team won her third Channel League singles title and advanced to the CIF quarterfinals.

In golf, Grace Hay of Bishop Diego won the CIF-SS Northern Regional title with a 1-under 69 at Los Robles Golf Course in Thousand Oaks.

Westmont's women's volleyball team enjoyed another successful season and advanced to the NAIA National Tournament.

Westmont cross country runner Michael Oldach placed eighth at the NAIA Nationals and earned All-American honors.

SBCC women's soccer just missed a third straight trip to the State Final Four, losing the regional final in overtime.

The defending state champion SBCC women's water polo team fell in the state semifinals and the Vaquero women's golf squad took fourth in the state.

The UCSB men's basketball team enjoyed a second straight 20-win season under coach Joe Pasternack. It was the first time the Gauchos (22-10) had back-to-back 20-win seasons since 1989-90 and they did it with five new starters. UCSB went 11-3 in the Big West and reached the conference tournament semifinals.

The Westmont men's and women's basketball teams returned to the NAIA Tournament.

Coach Kirsten Moore's women's team advanced to the nationals after becoming the first team to win the Golden State Athletic Conference Tournament in four straight years. Making the feat more impressive, Moore's team was primarily made up of freshmen.

Coach John Moore's men's team set a school record by appearing in its fifth straight national tournament.

High school basketball saw the Santa Barbara High and Carpinteria boys advance to the CIF semifinals. Santa Barbara rallied from an 18-point deficit to win its quarterfinal game. Carpinteria fought off crosstown rival Cate in its playoff run.

In soccer, the Bishop Diego boys celebrated their best season in school history, advancing to the CIF semifinals and making their first CIF Regional Tournament.

The San Marcos and Dos Pueblos boys' soccer teams reached the CIF guarterfinals.

Santa Barbara High's girls' water polo team made it to the CIF Division 2 semifinals and the Dos Pueblos girls won the consolation title in the eight-team Division 1 tournament.

Dos Pueblos ruled the Channel League again in wrestling and reached the CIF semifinals. Individually, senior Kade Uyesaka advanced to the State Meet.

DP fielded a girls' wrestling team and it won the league dual meet title in its first season.

The spring season has seen UCSB baseball go on a tear, winning more than 30 games before May and setting a program-record 13-game winning streak.

The Gauchos, who two years ago advanced to the College World Series for the first time, are seeking to win their first Big West title.

Santa Barbara High boys' volleyball won its Karch Kiraly Tournament of Champions for the first time since 2005 and went undefeated in the Channel League.

Also winning titles with unbeaten records were the San Marcos boys' tennis and lacrosse teams, Dos Pueblos softball and girls lacrosse teams and Santa Barbara High boys golf team.

Beau Allen of San Marcos made history, becoming the first prep in Santa Barbara County to high jump 7 feet. He is the state leader and is headed to Duke University.

Allen is one of several high school and college spring sports athletes and teams looking to make long runs in postseason competition.



The Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table Scholar Athlete of the Year Award was initiated in September 1986 after the Round Table's Board of Directors recognized the need to honor those students who are not only successful athletes, but who also maintain strong academic and extracurricular credentials.

The Revolution Soccer League creates a positive impact on the youth and families in the Santa Barbara community by developing and fostering a connection to the City, neighborhoods and local families through sports. Local youth now can participate in a year-round organized soccer league that is affordable to working parents. Most of the players participating in the Revolution Soccer League are underrepresented youth from lower income families that cannot afford soccer club fees.

Started in 2015, the league has grown to 3 seasons per year. Each season has over 60 teams and 600 youth participants and volunteer coaches. Although mostly boy participants, the league is considered coed with 20-30 girls participating each

weekend. League matches are officiated by trained officials and played on weekends at Ortega and Dwight Murphy parks.

Oscar García has always had a love for soccer. He did not have the opportunity to play on a soccer team, much less in a tournament, as a youth due to the fees associated with playing in organized sports. As a father, Oscar was interested in providing his son and other youth passionate about soccer the opportunity to play locally in Santa Barbara.

Starting a new league in Santa Barbara was not an easy task, requiring money and the ability to hurdle lots of challenges. A very important supporter was David Mora. David was very interested in Oscar's idea and asked Oscar to make a list of what he needed for the league. When Oscar provided the list, David delivered his support. Oscar's goal is to ensure opportunities for our local youth to play in affordable soccer programs continues to be offered and grow.

Russ Hargreaves was a dedicated member of the Santa Barbara Recreation Department. He spent a lifetime creating opportunities for others to enjoy the benefits of recreational activities. He loved jogging and was committed to total body fitness. He knew that a healthy mind and body were the first steps to a happy and productive life. This award is given to a person recognized by the Parks & Recreation Department as a leader in maintaining quality sports programs

R.F. MacFarland Memorial Award JANE CAIRNS, REEF AND RUN



Ocean swimming is Jane Cairns' passion, and, with the Pacific as her backyard, she wanted a way to share that passion with the community. When the idea of a weekly ocean swim was hatched 11 years ago, Cairns launched Reef and Run, a premiere weekly ocean swim race series on the South Coast. Cairns, with the help of an all-volunteer support network, orchestrates the Reef and Run series that offers three swim race lengths, 500m, 1000m (1k), and 1-mile. On occasion, a biathlon consisting of a 1k swim and 3k beach run is offered. Each season concludes with the extremely popular one-mile Boat to Beach swim, and an awards ceremony.

What started with 40 swimmers has grown to weekly average of 200, with more than 2500 athletes participating over the 13-week summer series on Thursday evenings at East Beach. Every Thursday, athletes ranging from 7 to 75 years of age line up to participate in one of the three race distances and then stay after to watch the sunset while enjoying food, drinks, live music, and camaraderie.

Cairns and the Reef and Run Committee are committed to supporting the next generation of ocean-loving swimmers and have raised over \$22,000 to support the Santa Barbara Junior Lifeguard Program and the Nick Johnson Scholarship Fund. If the Reef and Run series is not enough, Jane continues to pursue her passion by hosting the annual Semana Nautica 6-Mile Ocean Swim for the past 20 years, and serves as a board member and observer for the Santa Barbara Channel Swimming Association, helping swimmers safely cross the channel from the mainland to the islands.

R.F. MacFarland was one of the founders of Semana Nautica in 1936. This award is given annually to the person or organization who best exemplifies community leadership in the area of sports and athletics. It is sponsored by The City of Santa Barbara Parks and Recreation Department, local media and the Semana Nautica Association.

Sailing at the competitive level is physically and mentally challenging. Competing at the elite level requires the sailors to be highly fit and agile, as well as tactically and mechanically aware. To compete at this level for any length of time takes commitment – to compete at this level for over 46 years, makes you a "master of the sport." Ron Boehm learned to sail locally with the Sea Shells program - starting when he was 8 years old. And he has been raising the sail ever since! A Santa Barbara local since 1960, Ron attended Wooster College where he was the team captain of the sailing team in 1974/75.

After Wooster, he attended Cal where he received his MBA and then went on to Hastings for his JD....no doubt finding time to test his skills in the waters of the San Francisco Bay.

He has represented the SB Yacht Club in competitions for 52 years – and has raced International 14's for over 46 years including 18 World Championships from 1985 to 2018 - the most of any 14 sailor. His list of titles is long and impressive and includes being the National Champion in 1990 and 2004 and the Santa Cruz 27 National Champion in 2014. He also received the Santa Barbara Yacht Club – Outstanding Out-of-Town Result in 2004 and 2014. He crewed the Pacific Cup SF – Hawaii in 1984 taking 1st. He completed the Transpac LA – Hawaii in 1985.

When asked what his greatest accomplishment in sailing might be – Ron responded, "I've been blessed to have had more than forty years sailing a really fun high-performance boat, while competing against great friends from around the world who include Olympians, and world champions. I've had the chance to compete at the highest level in our class in fantastic destinations in England, Germany, Canada, Japan, New Zealand, and Australia."

And what keeps him committed to his sport after so many years? "What I love most about sailing is the variety. No two races are alike. The wind, waves, and current vary constantly, there is no track to follow as you move around the course, and you constantly have to strategize and outsmart your opponents. Sailing a two-hour race is both physical and mental."

This award was established and endowed by Louise Lowry Davis to encourage the continued participation in competitive sports, regardless of age. It is given for achievement by an athlete over the age of 40 years.

Along the way, his whole family got involved – son, Joe, as an assistant coach; wife, Davey keeping statistics; and daughter, Leah working the video camera. UCSB - Men's Baseball Coach

Andrew Checketts is in his eighth season as the head coach of the UCSB baseball program. He has an all-time record of 262-172-4 with UCSB and is the program's all-time leader in overall winning percentage (.603).

The 2019 season has been phenomenal for Checketts and his Gauchos – as of April 24th, their record is 31-5. And they are ranked No. 6 in the nation (highest ever was No. 5 in 1986). Under Checketts' leadership the Gauchos are currently riding a 13-game win streak which sets a new program record for UCSB. They had a 12-game winning streak earlier in the season which tied the record.

As the season heads towards the final few weeks, the Gauchos are in first place in the Big West with an 8-1 conference record – and will be seeking their first conference title since 1986 with a record of 20-1 record at home, 11-4 on the road 11-0 in series openers. They have won all eight, three-game series they have played -including six sweeps.

During his tenure, UCSB has had 39 Major League Baseball draftees, four All-America selections (Brett Vertigan in 2012, Joey Epperson in 2014, Dillon Tate in 2015, Shane Bieber in 2016), six Freshman All-America picks, the 2015 Big West Co-Field Player of the Year (Cameron Newell), and 44 All-Big West honorees.


