More than five decades ago, Jerry Harwin and Caesar Uyesaka sipped coffee at Caesar's Restaurant, talking about the need for a sports group in Santa Barbara that could help the local athletic community in times of need. After Jerry and Caesar shared a couple more coffee breaks together, the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table was born. Its motto: The advancement and betterment of all sports and athletics in the greater Santa Barbara area.

The SBART got off to a fast start. Its first organizational meeting was held at Santa Barbara's East Beach on January 25, 1968. Hundreds of people attended this meeting, and over 200 joined that evening as Charter Members. The SBART's first annual banquet was held at Santa Barbara City College on June 22, 1968. Through membership dues, contributions, fundraising events and local foundations, the Round Table has raised more than \$2 million for local athletics.

Harry's Plaza Café was the site of the SBART's first press luncheon held on September 14, 1970. The luncheons, initiated by the new president, Bill Bertka, were similar to a "Monday Morning Quarterback Club." All area schools were represented by the head coaches of the sports in season. For over four decades the SBART luncheons have been held at Harry's every Monday, attended by standing-room-only crowds.

Since its first meeting back in 1968, the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table has helped thousands of individuals and organizations by raising funds to support their athletic programs. The Round Table is proud to help student-athletes at all levels compete in events they would otherwise not have been able to attend. It is with our deepest regards and warmest thanks that we acknowledge and celebrate the vision and hard work of our founders, Caesar Uyesaka, Jerry Harwin and Bill Bertka.

MANDY BIBLE

Outstanding Athlete



It's only fitting that Mandy Bible still holds all of the assist records from her time competing in volleyball at Saint Mary's College from 2003-2007. The recurring theme of her amateur, professional, and coaching careers has been helping others even as she earned many incredible individual awards. One of her coaches shared, "Mandy has always been wise...Friends seek out her advice. She has been a reliable source of wisdom for me for many years, even when I was her coach." From her current role as assistant coach at Saint Mary's to coaching young children while competing in Europe to her many accomplishments on the court, it's clear that her impact on the game is more than significant and is only growing with time.

Mandy was a Channel League MVP, First Team Channel League in both volleyball and basketball, and recalls earning Round Table Player of the Week and Player of the Year honors while attending San Marcos High School from 1999 to 2003. Her coach still marvels at the way she walked onto his court as a freshman into a team with undefeated, gifted seniors with CIF finals experience and only needed about half an hour to earn her way from tryouts to the JV court and then on to the varsity team.

Continuing her education and volleyball career at Saint Mary's College, she earned degrees in Kinesiology and Anthropology and racked up an impressive list of accolades, including All-WCC Selections both athletic and academic, two time NCAA Player of the Week honors, the McKeon Award for top student athlete, and Hall of Fame inductions for both Saint Mary's and the West Coast Conference. Her total assists count of 5,362 and assists per game average of 12.47 still adorn the record books at Saint Mary's. She cites her proudest athletic achievement as defeating Cal on their home floor to advance to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament in 2004.

She competed professionally in Slovenia and Austria, finishing in the top three of league competition in four out of five years. She was voted Slovenia's best setter in 2014, again earning recognition for her assists. She met her husband, Uros, in Slovenia and they now return several times per year with their son Kai to visit family. Mandy shared that her toughest moment was losing her mother to brain cancer during her senior year at Saint Mary's, but like a true leader and teammate, she didn't miss a game despite the difficult challenge she was facing off the court.

Mandy's coaches rave about her, describing her as "kind, sincere, direct...simply tough" and "destined for greatness." That destiny has already been realized, and she will surely surpass all expectations as she continues to build her legacy.

DAX HOLDREN

Outstanding Athlete



Dax Holdren is synonymous with volleyball in Santa Barbara and his personal and professional achievements remain an inspiration to this day for those toiling on the hot beach sand. He's always been a well-rounded athlete since his days at San Marcos High School. Halfway through his time there, he made the switch from baseball to volleyball. After building on his high school successes at Santa Barbara City College, he decided to join forces with former Royal teammate Todd Rogers to set out on a professional beach volleyball career. Joining the AVP in 1997, the pair quickly made a name for themselves earning Rookie of the Year honors. The duo had eight wins together, including a World Tour victory in 2000, five AVP titles, and a fifth-place finish in the 2001 World Championships.

He later partnered with Eric Fonoimoana on the AVP tour for two seasons, and they were considered the dominant force in the game, almost guaranteed to represent the United States at the upcoming 2004 Olympic games. A knee injury sidetracked Holdren in 2003 and his Olympic dream seemed to be slipping away. However, his dedication to his craft and determination to rehab and come back stronger surprised the volleyball world. He joined up with a similarly hard-working and scrappy partner in Stein Metzger and they made a late run for the Olympic team. Not only did they earn a silver medal at the 2003 Beach Volleyball World Championships in Rio de Janeiro, but they also secured one of the two coveted spots on the US Olympic Team for the following year. At the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens, Greece, Dax represented his community proudly and earned a fifth-place finish.

Over his professional career, Holdren had 14 total wins on the AVP tour and found great success on the international stage. For a local little league convert who only started playing volleyball his junior year of high school to reach such heights in the sport only proves how drive, determination, and persistence can pay off in a big way. He continues to be a force in the athletics, helping local youth volleyball and basketball leagues in Santa Barbara where he lives with his wife, Jen, and their two children, Kobe and Ellis.

THALIA ORMSBY

Outstanding Athlete



When reviewing the athletic achievements of Thalia Ormsby in water polo, what jumps off the page most is the consistency of her excellence. For the better part of a decade, her biography is littered with All-American selections, First Team season and championship tournament honors, scoring streaks, and victories with Team USA on the international stage. Beyond her individual achievements, even more impressive perhaps are her continued efforts to build the sport as a volunteer youth water polo coach and club coach in Southern California.

Thalia attended Santa Barbara High School where she lettered four years in water polo and three in swimming under coach Mark Walsh. She earned an incredible number of MVP honors for Channel League, CIF Division II, Southern California Championships, and with the National Youth Team. A four time All-American and two-time Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table Athlete of the Year, Ormsby's trophy case was overflowing even before she matriculated to UCLA for her university career.

To nobody's surprise, Thalia's list of accolades only continued to grow with the Bruins. She contributed early as a freshman, scoring goals at the MPSF Championships and the NCAA semifinals. As a sophomore she almost doubled her goal count from the previous year and led the team with 23 assists. Taking off 2003 as a redshirt to train with the US National Team, she helped the Americans win first place at the Holiday Cup, Pan American Games, and FINA World Championships. 2004 was another redshirt year at UCLA, but this time the challenge was representing the US on the biggest stage. Thalia scored against Italy at the Athens Olympic games and cites the team's comeback to win the bronze medal after a heartbreaking loss in the semi-finals as both her proudest achievement and toughest moment in her athletic career.

Thalia returned to UCLA and packed the last few empty corners of her trophy case in 2005, racking up First Team AWPCA All-American and First Team All-NCAA and All-MPSF Tournament honors. She led the team in field saves with 19, was second in steals with 69, and second in goals with 53 for the season. She now works as a 6th grade teacher in Del Mar, CA, and surfs, swims, and competes in triathlons. She brings the same passion and excellence witnessed throughout her career to raising her family with her spouse, Brett Ormsby, and to her work as an educator.

Outstanding Athlete



Leadership is a quality that is valued highly by coaches and teammates alike, and this inductee to the Hall of Fame has it in spades. Sara Ovadia not only led by example during her high school, collegiate, and professional golfing career, but now guides student athletes as a coach. She's never backed down from a challenge, and her accomplishments on and off the course speak for themselves.

A four-year letter winner at Dos Pueblos High School and team captain in her senior year, Sara was not only a Channel League champion, but also helped the team earn four CIF Northern Division titles and two CIF Southern Section titles. During these years, she competed on the American Junior Golf Association Tour, earning two fifth-place finishes.

Her dedication to her craft and her education continued at Columbia University where she not only earned a double major in Philosophy and History, but also served in the leadership role of Team Captain from her sophomore year through graduation. Her proudest achievement came in 2007 when she was the Ivy League Individual Champion and helped the Lions capture the Ivy League Team Championship. Even in victory, she had to overcome the challenge and disappointment of just missing out on qualifying for the 2007 NCAA National Championship, citing that moment as the toughest in her competitive career. She was a Connie S. Maniatty Award Finalist for Outstanding Senior Student-Athlete and was the first golfer to be inducted in the Columbia Athletics Hall of Fame.

Sara played professionally on the LPGA's developmental tour over the course of four years and has continued competing to this day in SCPGA club professional tournaments. She qualified for the LPGA Safeway Classic in Portland, Oregon and became the first golfer from Columbia University to compete in an LPGA tournament. Most recently, she's earned SCPGA Women's Matchplay Champion titles in 2017 and 2018 and was the 2018 SCPGA Women's Team Champion and Associate Player of the Year.

Despite the effort and time commitment it takes to compete professionally, Sara continues to display her strong work ethic as an assistant coach for the Girl's Golf and Basketball teams at Santa Ynez High School and as a golf professional at La Purisima Golf Course in Lompoc, CA. She lives with her wife, Ashley Coelho, in Buellton, CA and continues to make her mark as a leader, competitor, and incredible asset to our community.

TIM TRIGUIERO

Outstanding Athlete



Tim Trigueiro, Santa Barbara native and tennis champion, is continuing a family legacy of athletic success by following his father and high school coach, Jack Trigueiro, into the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table Hall of Fame. Even after his triumphant competitive career, Tim has further made his mark on the US tennis community by teaching the game at all levels for the past 25 years. Longtime coach and friend, Larry Mousouris, describes him as a "fearless competitor" but also shared, "The thing I value most about Tim is how loyal he is and what a genuinely caring person he is."

Tim attended Santa Barbara High School and was a 4-time Channel League Champion, MVP in both singles and team competitions, CIF Individual Finalist, and an Ojai Interscholastic Champion. Even at this age, he was making a name for himself on the national stage. In 1984, he reached the round of 16 at the United States open and in 1985 represented the US in singles and doubles at the French Open, Wimbledon, and the United States Open. Most impressively, he won seven straight matches at the 1985 US Open to take the World Junior Championship title.

Coming out of high school, he was the #1 college recruit in the United States and decided to attend UCLA. In his freshman year, he played singles and doubles and helped the Bruins reach a perfect 10-0 Pac 10 season. In 1987, he led the team to a NCAA Division 1 final berth. Later transferring to Southern Methodist University, he became the S.E.C. individual singles and doubles champion. Graduating in 1990, Tim went on to play 5 years on the ATP World Tour, traveling extensively and competing professionally at the US Open and the Wimbledon Championships.

After spending twenty years in Santa Monica working in real estate and as a financial advisor, Tim and his wife Sarah returned to our community and currently live in Carpinteria. Tim coached as a volunteer at both Loyola Marymount University and at Santa Barbara High School. The Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table is honored to induct into our Hall of Fame one of the best tennis players ever from this area.

ABE JAHADHMY

Outstanding Coach



Abe Jahadhmy is one of the most well-known and respected members of the local athletic community, having contributed in so many ways over the past four and a half decades. He attended Dos Pueblos High School in the early 1970s and earned 1st Team All-League Honors and was voted the team MVP, but his accomplishments as a coach and athletic director are even more impressive.

After graduating from high school, Jahadhmy attended Santa Barbara City College and competed for several years until the soccer program was cut, later continuing his education at UC Santa Barbara and earning a degree in Sociology and an Athletic Coaching Certification. These qualifications set him up perfectly for his long, successful career coaching basketball and soccer teams and officiating the same sports. From 1975 to 1994, he coached travelling teams, overlapping his position as Head Soccer Coach at San Marcos High School from 1989-2002. His leadership and team accomplishments won him CIF Coach of the Year honors in 1998 and 2002, State Coach of the Year in 2002, Far West United State Coach of the Year in 2002, and Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table Coach of the Year in 1998.

During this same period, he refereed youth and adult basketball and soccer, ran clinics, and put on sports camps in the local area. Abe shared that his toughest moment in athletics was coaching his final game in 2002. Even though he has continued to make a tremendous impact on the local community and student athletes in his current position as San Marcos High School Athletic Director, there was something special about coaching that he still cherishes. He is most proud about seeing former players he coached become contributing members of the community and remaining friends with them.

It's very clear that Abe lives his vision as a leader in the athletic community. He imparted the values of caring for his athletes, holding them accountable, and ensuring that they had a lot of fun playing sports. Many of his former athletes have used the skills they learned under his tutelage, including dedication, good sportsmanship, and persistence to go on to great success in athletics and in their professional careers.

GREG TEBBE

Outstanding Community Leader



Greg Tebbe is described by his friends and colleagues as “an incredible human being and role model” and “the greatest tennis event organizer that ever lived.” His athletic and professional accomplishments are so varied and impressive that it’s difficult to know where to start! By tracing his journey from his roots at Santa Barbara High School through his professional careers in both tennis and finance, one can start to grasp the impact he has had on our community and the world, and certainly understand why he is an honored inductee to the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table Hall of Fame.

Greg attended Santa Barbara High School from 1978 to 1981, competing in varsity tennis and earning All Channel League honors. He was co-captain in his senior year, a CIF finalist, and was a member of the boys teams that won the Channel League championship three times. Following graduation, he continued his tennis career at Harvard while earning his BA in economics. Later, he went on to play tennis professionally in France and Sweden, but the joy of the game never left. He continued competing, even ranking in the top 20 nationally in his age group in 2014.

He is especially proud of competing with the nationally ranked Harvard tennis team and still recalls his first matches during his freshman year, traveling with the team to compete against Clemson University and the University of South Carolina. Just as impressive as his individual accomplishments are the honors earned by the boys and girls varsity tennis teams he’s coached at Santa Barbara High School. 16 combined Channel League champions, a CIF team championship, and a multitude of other accolades have joined the trophy case under his tutelage.

Off the court, he was just as ambitious and successful, working his way up the ladder at Goldman Sachs from analyst to Partner and eventually serving as the head of the Global Foreign Exchange and Emerging Markets trading business. His volunteer work with the Foundation for Santa Barbara High School and the Santa Barbara Tennis Patrons ensures the local tennis community will continue to grow and strengthen, affording more opportunities for our student-athletes.

Greg and his wife Daphne are also especially proud of their three children, Christina, Andrew, and Peter. Like their father, they’ve all walked the halls of Santa Barbara High School and will surely follow in his footsteps as they build their own lists of accomplishments. One colleague of his shares, “Greg has and continues to display an extraordinary level of integrity, dignity, humility, love, and commitment to everything he is connected to.” The Round Table is honored and humbled to welcome such a deserving individual to our Hall of Fame.

In Memoriam



Clifden Purcell

March 13, 1936 to June 21, 2019

Cliff began his coaching career in 1958 as a varsity football assistant at Carpinteria High School. Ultimately, his life as a counselor and coach would span more than forty years and five sports and his guidance would positively impact the lives of thousands of young people. His motto in life and on the field – Never Give Up!

Coach Purcell was selected as Channel League Coach of the Year twice and in 1999 was chosen by The California Coaches Association as The California State High School Golf Coach of the Year. In 2008 Cliff Purcell was inducted into the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table Hall of Fame and in 2013 he received the first Lifetime Achievement Award from the San Marcos High School Golf Team. When asked about his proudest achievement, Coach said, "I am most proud of seeing the hundreds of young men and women, with whom I have had contact, go on to become successful and productive citizens of our community."

A few weeks ago, at the first Press Lunch, Delta Tau Delta, made a donation in Cliff's memory in appreciation of all the mentoring he provided the UCSB fraternity members. It was only fitting that it be used to help sponsor tonight's event – not only was Cliff a Hall of Fame Inductee but his daughter, Jeanie served as Chair of the Hall of Fame Committee for years and her parents were always there helping!
