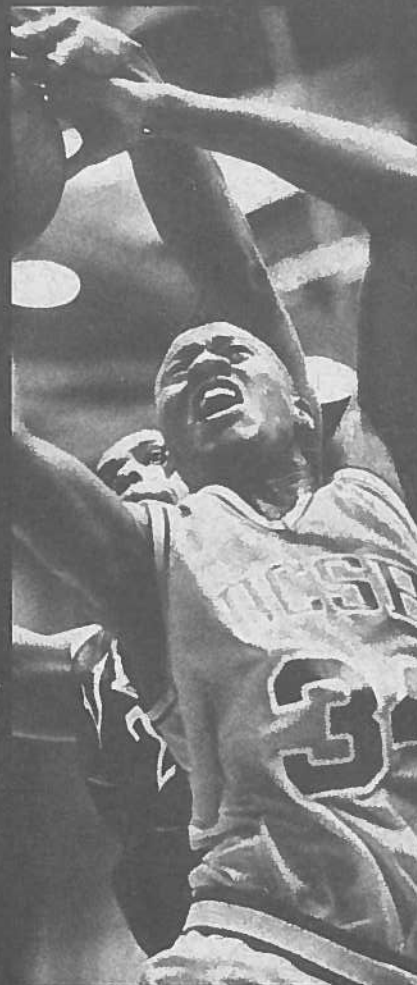

Welcome


Dear Honorees, Families and Athletic Community:

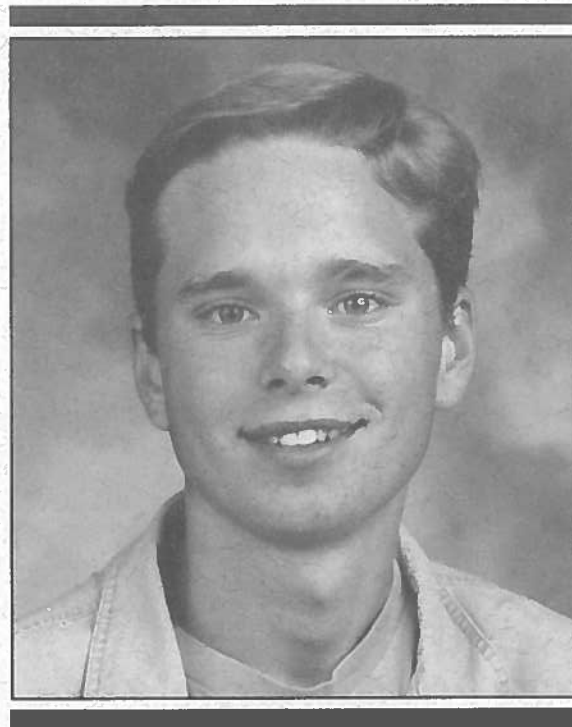

The basketball team also benefited from his athletic skill and he served as team captain for two years.

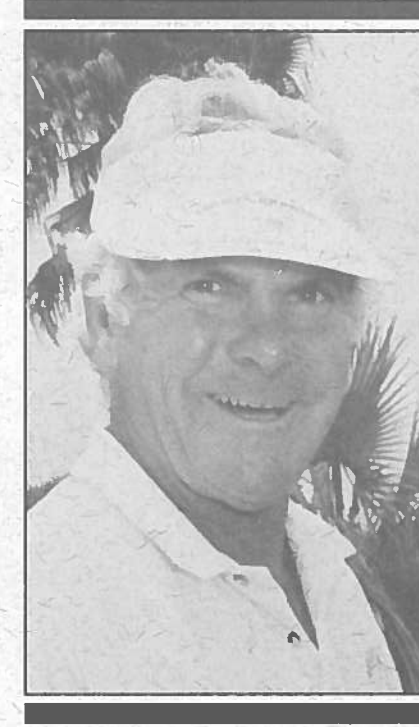

As the City Recreation Aquatics Supervisor from 1969 to 1992, Paul has been responsible for the S.B. city beaches, pools, beach volleyball, coordination of many of the Semana Nautica Events, summer aquatics camps and swim programs. He has been committed to the junior lifeguard program and supporting the city lifeguard training and service. Paul recently hosted the National Surf Lifesaving Association conference here and plans to host the Australian Surf Lifesaving team this summer.

Paul graduated from UCSB in 1960. His early career started as a lifeguard. He has also been a star competitor in dory races, skin-diving, swimming and volleyball.

Carol Smith has given Santa Barbara 42 years of professional recreation service. Following her graduation from UCLA in 1949, Carol became the Program Director the local YMCA where she directed the day and overnight camp programs plus teen activities. In 1970, she became the special activities supervisor for the City Parks and Recreation Department. As you can imagine, winter is her favorite time of the year. This is when she travels with the special Olympics team to Big Bear, Tahoe and Mammoth Lakes. No doubt about it, she is the best skier in her family and has more skiing experience than her brother Andy, or her parents Susan and Agris Petersons. On family ski trips, she is the patient one, waiting for her father to catch up; or she is the one "looking for some good competition."

Amy has been employed by Westmont College Food Service for the past six years. In addition to this, she does volunteer work for the Santa Barbara Medical Foundation, United Cerebral Palsy and is a Board member of the Association for the Retarded Citizens.

We applaud her courage, her dedication and her talent.

History of the Athletic Round Table

Twenty-five years ago, Jerry Harwin and Caesar Uyesaka sat sipping coffee at Caesar's Restaurant, talking about the need for a sports group in Santa Barbara that could pitch in and help out the local athletic community in times of need. After Jerry and Caesar shared a couple more coffee breaks together, the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table was born. Its motto: *The advancement and betterment of all sports and athletics in the greater Santa Barbara area.*

The Round Table got off to a fast start. Its first organizational meeting was held at Santa Barbara's East Beach on January 25, 1968. Hundreds of people attended this meeting and over 200 joined that evening as Charter Members.

The Round Table's first annual banquet was held at Santa Barbara City College on June 22, 1968. A number of outstanding athletes in a variety of sports were honored and the evening's highlight was the induction of local athletes into the Round Table's *Hall of Fame*.

Harry's Plaza Cafe was the site of the Round Table's first press luncheon held on September 14, 1970. This program was initiated by the new-president, Bill Bertka. These weekly luncheons were similar to a "Monday Morning Quarterback Club." All nine area schools were represented by the head coaches of the sport in season. For 23 years, the Round Table luncheons have continued to be held at Harry's every Monday, attended by standing-room only crowds.

Since their first meeting back in 1968, the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table has helped hundreds of individuals and organizations by raising funds to support their athletic programs. Through membership dues, contributions, fund-raisers, and grant applications, the Round Table has raised more than \$1,500,000!

Funds are distributed according to need. The Round Table is proud that it has been able to help athletes at all levels compete in events they would otherwise not have been able to attend. With continued community support, the Round Table is confident Santa Barbara's sports opportunities will continue to grow with each new season.

Louise Lowry Davis Award

Louise Lowry Davis was Supervisor of the S.B. Recreation Dept. for over 30 years before retirement in 1966. As director of the Women's Sports League, she made women's sports activities one of the biggest draws in town in the 1930's and 40's. This award is given to a woman recognized as a player, coach or sponsor who excels in leadership and sportsmanship.

Alice Henry

Alice has been an Associate Athletic Director at UCSB since 1980. Her efforts on behalf of UCSB athletics have resulted in unprecedented success among the women's programs. The development of women's volleyball, women's basketball, women's soccer, women's tennis, men's tennis and men's soccer into national powers is directly a result of her tireless work and effort. UCSB annually hosts a number of NCAA events, also a result of Alice's efforts.

Alice Henry is a member of the Board of Directors of the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table. As UCSB's senior Women's Administrator, Alice is one of the true pioneers and leaders in the area of women's athletics. She has served on a number of national committees dealing with women's athletics, including the NCAA Division I women's volleyball and women's soccer committees.

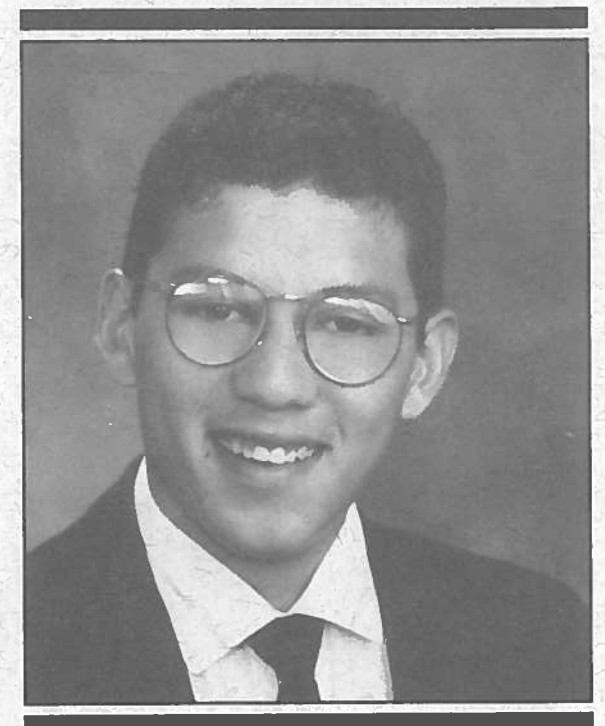
The community organizations that benefit from her membership include: Channel City Women's Forum, Soroptimist International of Santa Barbara, UCSB's Alumni-Athletics Hall of Fame Committee and The Big West Conference Council. She also finds time to administer the Big West Conference Tennis Championships held in Ojai. With all this, Alice still makes time to be the driving force behind UCSB's Athletics' Drug and Alcohol Education and Prevention program. Alice earned her master's degree from San Jose State and coached women's basketball, volleyball and tennis in addition to teaching physical education courses at Westmont.

Jerry & Jerry Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 1991 to honor Jerry Pimm, the UCSB basketball coach, and his arch-rival and friend, Jerry Tarkanian, basketball coach of UNLV. 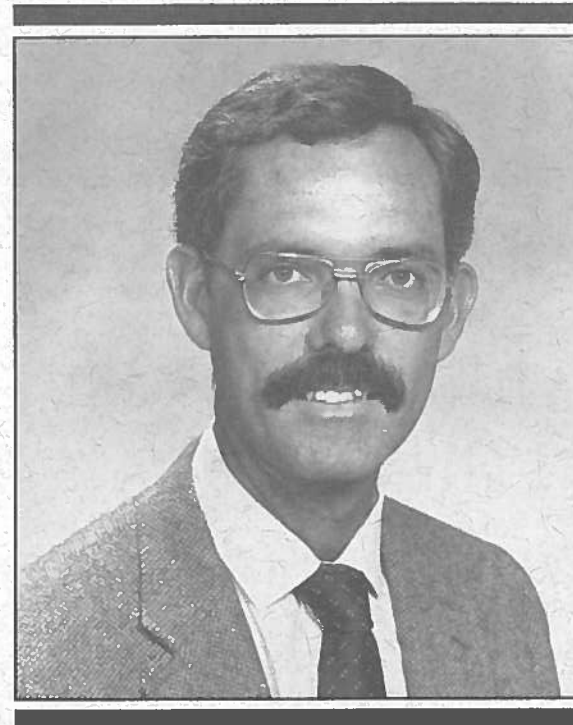

Mark French University of California at Santa Barbara

Mark French has vaulted the Lady Gauchos Basketball program into national recognition. Five years ago, the thought of UCSB becoming a power in women's basketball was far-fetched at best. Heck, UCSB was 10 – 44 in the previous two seasons combined. Five years later the Gauchos are Big West Champions and on the verge of cracking the top 25 for the first time ever. They went on to the NCAA Tournament and had a tremendous showing against Stanford, the eventual champion.

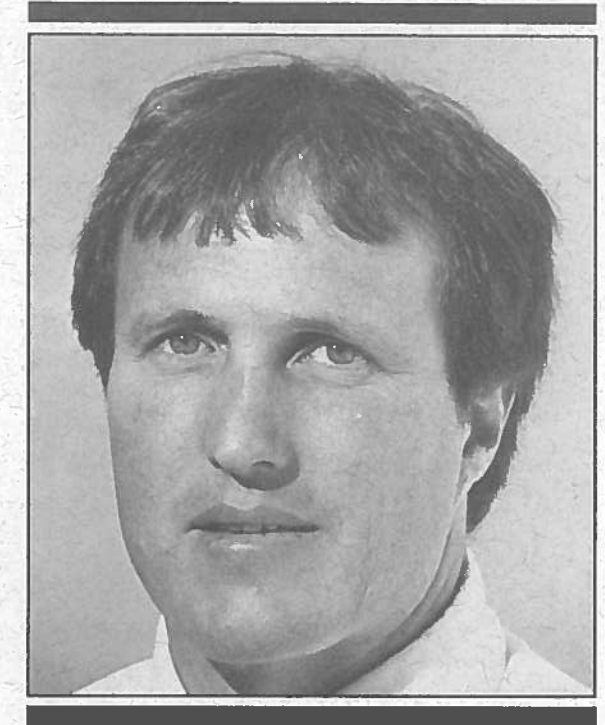
French guided the Gauchos to their best finish ever with a 23 – 4 regular season mark and 16 – 2 Big West record. It was the first league championship in school history and that includes men's basketball. At the end of the 1992 season, French was named Big West Coach of the Year. French has lead UCSB on a season of firsts. The Gauchos ended a 26 game, 13 year lifetime losing streak to Long Beach State. They beat UCLA for the first time in 13 tries. They snapped an 0 – 9 streak in Hawaii's Klum Gym and captured wins for the first time a New Mexico State and Fresno State. The Gauchos also matched a school record twice with eight consecutive wins.

French is a UCSB alum and letter-winner in both baseball and basketball. Mark is married to Mary Sue and they have two sons and a daughter. His sons, Nolan and Matthew, are the Gauchos ballboys.

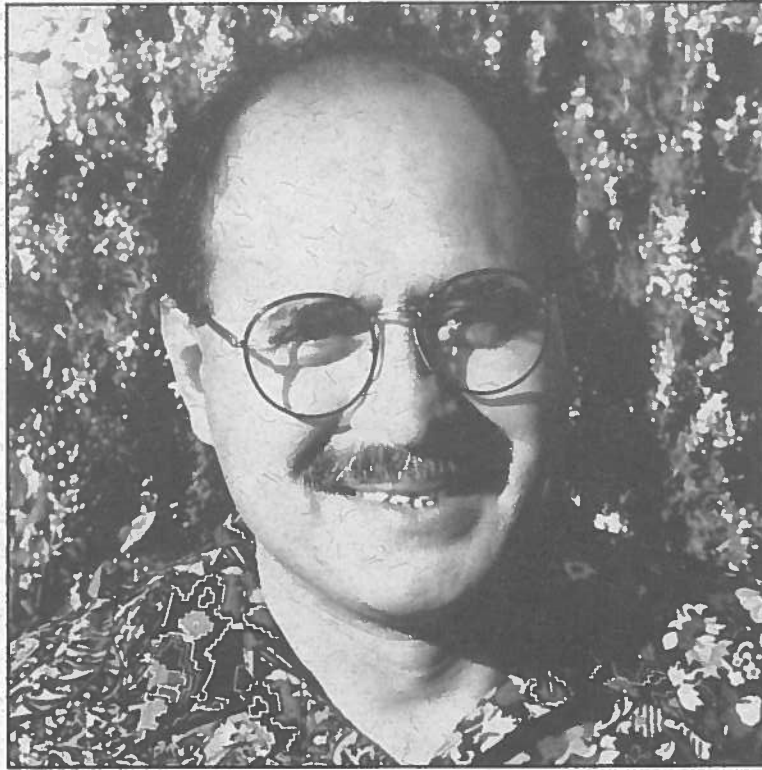
During this school year, his team was co-champion of the Tri-Valley League and had a terrific play-off performance in winning the CIF-Division 9 Title for the fourth time in five years.

Far greater than a "Youth-Worker," Salvador Rodriguez is the Goleta Boys and Girls Club. He

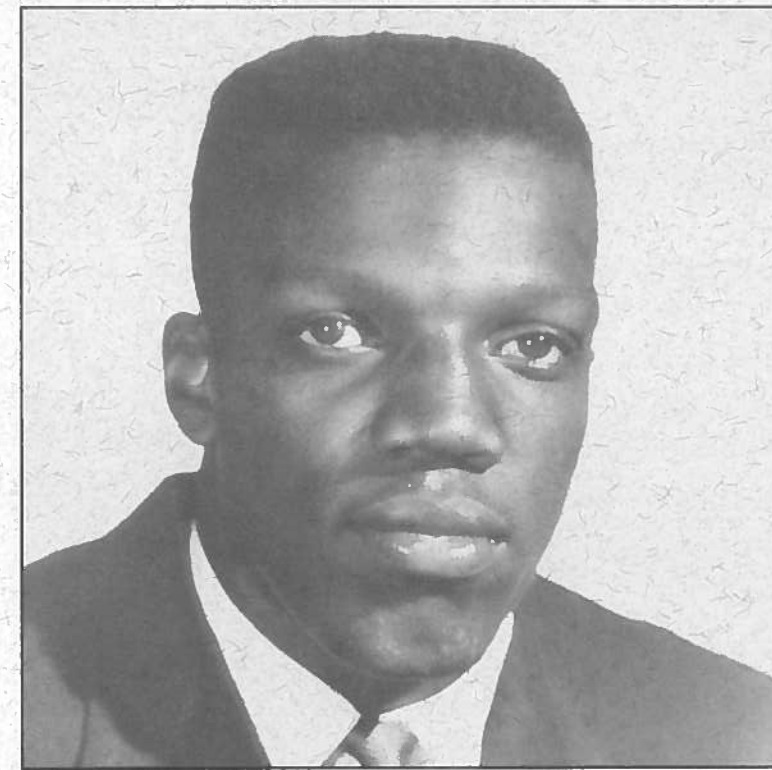
served as Athletic Director from 1970 to 1973 and as Unit Director from 1973 to 1992.

Pete O'Garro is an endangered species and should be protected. That is why he is being inducted into the Hall of Fame.

All CIF in three sports! While at Santa Barbara High School in 1947, 1948 and 1949, O'Garro starred as a receiver and tailback in Clarence Schutte's single wing, played center on the basketball team and was an outstanding catcher for the Dons' baseball team.

Playing and lettering in three sports is a rare achievement in itself, but making the elite all-CIF team in those three sports wins Pete a place in the all-time category. He is truly one of the great high school athletes of this community.

If O'Garro walked into a SBART Press Luncheon, we would all say: "Now there is a professional tight end." Maybe that's because he was a tight

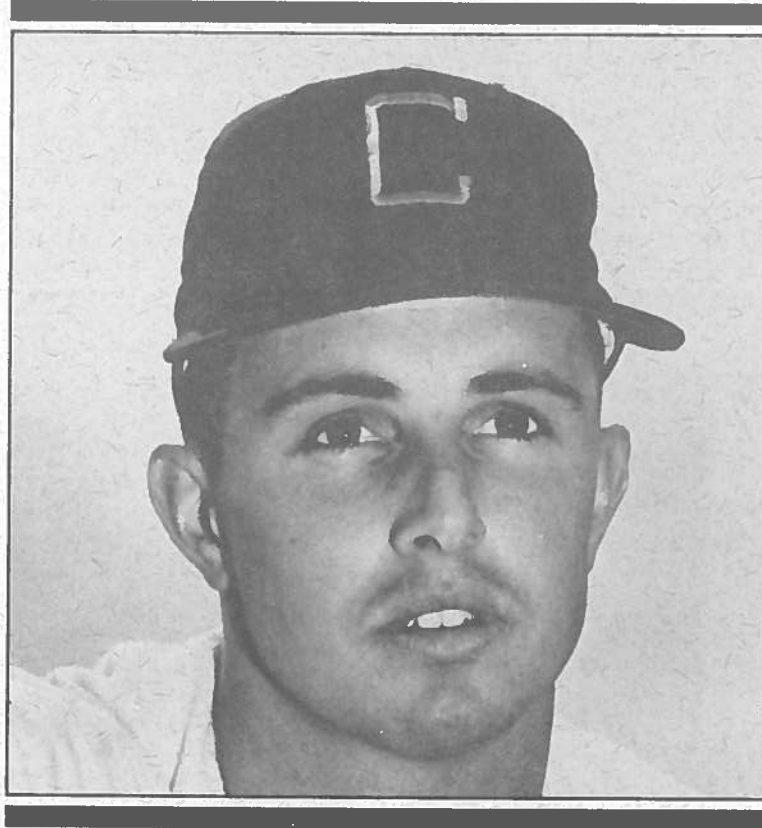
end with the Toronto Argonauts for five years following his graduation from UCLA in 1956. After a year each at Compton College and UCLA, the Korean War got in his way, but following a two year stint with the U.S. Army, he returned to UCLA in the fall of 1954.

O'Garro not only started for the UCLA football Bruins, he earned All-Pacific Coast Conference Honors. He was drafted by the NFL's New York Giants, but elected to play in Toronto where he was "Rookie of the Year" and an All-Pro-All-Star.

O'Garro has since been involved in the life insurance business. He has also worked with Willie Naulls, UCLA basketball-great, in the Colonel Sanders franchise. He is recently retired from fifteen years with the County of Los Angeles.

BILL OAKLEY
Outstanding Athlete

You will find Bill Oakley's name is listed in the baseball record book of Berkeley's University of California Bears. In fact, you will find Oakley's name in several of the Bear baseball records: ERA's, wins, strikeouts and innings pitched.

Prior to those record producing performances, Oakley was winning six varsity letters while attending Santa Barbara High School and was awarded that school's most prestigious award, "*Best All-Around Athlete*" in 1958, his senior year.

Those six letters came as an all-league tailback in football, a starting guard in basketball, and as an all-league pitcher in baseball.

When asked what Oakley's qualities were, Chuck Sylvester, his high school coach said: "His great fast

ball, excellent curve, intelligence and maybe most of all, his competitive spirit." Whatever these qualities were, the Bear's coaching staff liked them also.

Their judgement proved very sound. Oakley's 1962 ERA of 1.44 led to his second All-Conference selection as well as a berth on the elite All-District Eight team. He was also voted the Bear's MVP.

Not surprisingly, he won the "*Big 5 Medal*" as "*Cal's Finest Student Athlete*."

Oakley later played with the NY Mets organization but the call of a pharmaceutical career was too great. He is presently the pharmacist at Cottage Hospital.

In his own Hall of Fame are his wife, Joan; daughter, Cheryl; and son, Bill Jr.

Outstanding Coach

A big chunk of artillery shrapnel in Vietnam couldn't stop U.S. Army 1st Lieutenant Lou Panizzon. Slow him down maybe, but not stop him. And neither could opposing football coaches. So it not his Purple Heart, nor the Bronze Star he was awarded for valor in combat, that has qualified Coach Panizzon for his induction into the Hall of Fame.

It is for his outstanding tenure as Head Football Coach at Carpinteria High School from 1975 to 1989. Few high school coaches ever realize the degree of success that Lou has attained.

Four CIFSS Championships and runner-up on two other occasions is the essence of dreams. His win-loss record of 133-43-2 includes nine Tri-Valley League football championships.

And while he was compiling that outstanding record, he was also winning that most coveted

honor, the respect of his peers. Hardly is there a more respected coach than Lou.

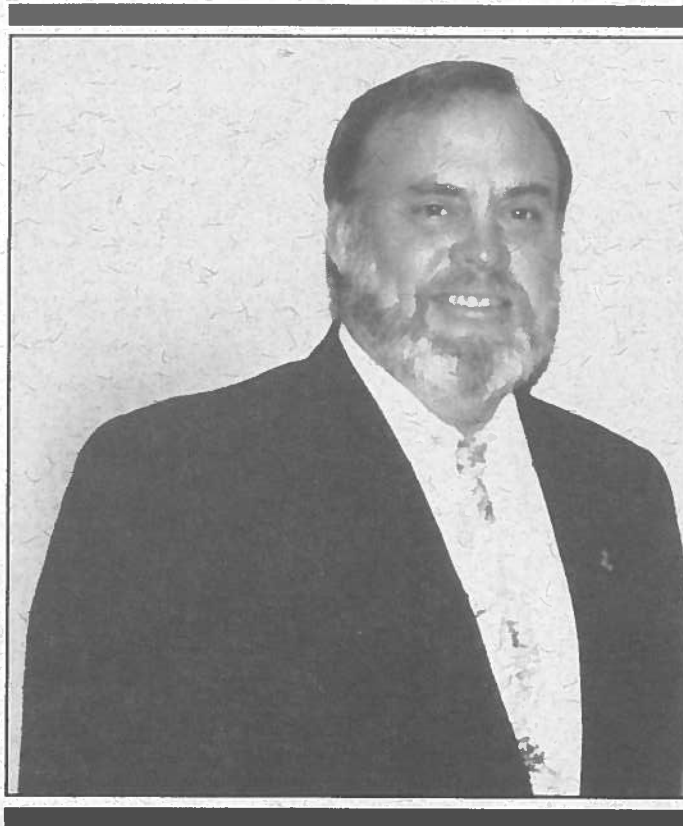
Not only was he winning games and respect, he was creating an athletic program that has brought deep pride to his school and his community.

Back in 1984, these two men were looking for a place for youth basketball teams to play and said to each other, "Why don't we just build our own facility?" With their energies combined, leading a drive with countless volunteers and supporters, that's exactly what they did. After eight years and two million dollars worth of fund raising, grants, private donations, time and labor commitments, bank support and donated materials, The Goleta Valley Youth Sports Center was built. The new athletic facility, is the home of four volley courts, two full-length basketball courts with hardwood floors, baseball fields, meeting rooms, equipment rooms and a soon-to-be park and Youth Football League field.

Founded in 1984, the organization that carried the

Their resumes are full of other titles as well, such as coach, board member, president or vice president of youth sports activities.

Both men credit their families for their success: Toni Holdren and sons, Clay, Dare and Rand; Dee Wipf and sons, Mark and Eric.

It should also serve as a reminder to the community that it is possible for a student to participate in athletics and still maintain outstanding academic achievement.
